

### REVISED BY-LAWS



### 14th Annual Fluke Tournament "Van Duyn Combo"

The 14th Annual Fluke Tournament (VanDuyn Combo) to be held on July 26th is set to be not only the biggest single fluke tournament on the East Coast but also the first time for a concurrent new Catch & Release Kayak Division. This combination includes the Power Boat Division which will be the same as last year with the prize money going to the heaviest fluke caught while the Kayak Catch & Release Division will have their own prizes for the longest fluke caught. How do we know how long the fish is?? Each kayak captain will have a measuring stick assigned to his kayak and must take a digital picture of each fish he wishes to enter and then release the fish back into the water. At the end of the day, the kayak captain will deliver the disk from the camera to the judges and each will be viewed on a computer screen to verify the length. The judge's decision will be final. The Catch & Release Division must deliver their disks by 3 PM to be judged and the power boat division will end fishing at 3:30 PM. This year the kayak division will be capped at 100 kayaks. The picnic to follow the day's event should provide some interesting fish stories. If you want to be part of this epic event, please join us as a fishing participant or purchase picnic tickets at the gate.

As you can imagine, the expectation of 1400 power boat fishermen and 100 kayak fishermen coming together has been very exciting. Your fluke committee has been planning since January to make this an "over the top" successful event which will be carried in major fishing magazines, newspapers and in new venues that include kayak fishing.

**COME ON DOWN TO HEAR JOE OZ FOR YOUR LISTENING & DANCING PLEASURE ON JUNE 28TH FROM 6 TO 10 PM**

*I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.*

It is the universal custom to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and on stationary flagstaffs in the open. However, when a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed 24 hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness. The flag should be hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously. It should not be displayed on days when the weather is inclement, except when an all-weather flag is displayed. The flag should be displayed daily, on or near the main administration building of every public institution...in or near every polling place on election days...during school days in or near every schoolhouse.

No other flag or pennant should be placed above or, if on the same level, to the right of the flag of the United States of America except during church services conducted by naval chaplains at sea...for personnel of the Navy...when the church pennant may be flown above the flag.

No person shall display the flag of the United Nations or any other national or international flag equal, above, or in a position of superior prominence or honor to, or in place of, the flag of the United States or any Territory or possession thereof: **provided**, that nothing in this section shall make unlawful the continuance of the practice heretofore followed of displaying the flag of the United Nations in a position of superior prominence or honor, with that of the flag of the United States at the headquarters of the United Nations.

The flag, when carried in a procession or with another flag or flags, should be either on the marching right: that is, the flag's own right, or, if there is a line of other flags, in front of the center of that line. It should not be displayed on a float in a parade except from a staff (or as against a wall or in a window.) That no disrespect should be shown to the flag of the United States it should not be dipped to any person or thing. Regimental colors, State flags, organization flags or institutional flags are to be dipped as a mark of honor. The flag should never be carried flat or horizontally, but always aloft and free.

During the ceremony of hoisting or lowering the flag or when the flag is passing in a parade or in review, all persons present except those in uniform should face the flag and stand at attention with the right hand over the heart. Those present in uniform should render the military salute. When not in uniform, men should remove their hat with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Aliens should stand at attention. The salute to the flag in a moving column should be rendered at the moment the flag passes.

The flag should never touch anything beneath it such as the ground, floor, water or merchandise. It should never be fastened, displayed, used or stored in such a manner as to permit it to be easily torn, soiled or damaged in any way.

The flag should never be used for advertising purposes in any manner whatsoever. It should not be embroidered on such articles as cushions or handkerchiefs and the like, printed or otherwise impressed on paper napkins or boxes or anything that is designed for temporary use and discard. Advertising signs should not be fastened to a staff or halyard from which the flag is flown.

The flag should never be used as wearing apparel. No part of the flag should be used as a costume or athletic uniform but a flag patch may be affixed to the uniform of military, firemen, policemen and members of patriotic organizations.

The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning.



On Sunday, May 25th Pt. Pleasant Lodge was well represented at the Pt. Pleasant Boro Memorial Day parade. Our own John Kaufman was one of the Grand Marshals and was awarded a plaque commemorating his years of service in WWII. Carrying the Auxiliary flag are Ann Kaufman and Joan Perucich and carrying the Lodge flag are ER Mitch Fiedler and Scot Famous.

**THANK YOU ALL!**

The Ladies Auxiliary has revised their By-Laws and would like these revisions printed in the Antler. The following revisions only replace the 1995 Articles & Sections as outlined.

### **ARTICLE I – PURPOSE**

Section A: An official, recognized, independent entity of the Point Pleasant BPO Elks #1698 (the Lodge), the Ladies Auxiliary (Auxiliary) aims and purposes are consistent with those of the Order.

Section B: Support the Lodge and remain aware of their needs and be of assistance when possible.

### **ARTICLE II – MEMBERSHIP**

Section A. Membership in the Auxiliary shall consist of females of good character, not under the age of 21, and who believe in God, who have been and hereafter, be duly elected and initiated under the Auxiliary ritual.

Section B: A member in Good Standing has paid dues for the current year, by June 1, and has attended a minimum of three (3) meetings in a twelve (12) month period and/or waived by a 2/3 vote of the members at a business meeting.

Section C: A person desiring membership in this Auxiliary must request an application form from a member in Good Standing.

### **ARTICLE III– DUES**

Section A: The amount of Auxiliary dues shall be initiated by a motion brought on the floor, a reading of that motion at the following meeting and posting of the motion in the President's message in the Antler. A 2/3 vote of members in attendance at the next business meeting after the reading is required to affix dues. This procedure shall be in place for regular, life and widowed members.

Section B: Dues are payable between April 1 and June 1.

Section C: An amount of \$1.50, from the annual individual dues shall be earmarked and maintained in a separate Benevolent Account. Upon the demise of an Auxiliary member, it is the policy of the Auxiliary to donate \$25.00 to the Special Needs Children's Committee for placement on the Lamp of Memory.

## **HOOP SHOOT FINALS 2007-8**

The Elks National Hoop Shoot competition came to a stunning end on April 26th in Springfield, MA. Our two State & Regional champions, Lindsey Havens and Kelly Hughes were ready along with 70 other kids from all over the USA. Remember, these are the 72 best free-throw shooters out of approximately 3 million contestants who started at the local level across the country.

Lindsay was the 4th shooter of 12 in the 10-11 year old division. She hit 7 out of 10 in the 1st round, very respectable considering the nervous feelings she may have had. Others hit more, others hit less but one girl hit all 10. The second round of 15 shots, Lindsey sank 12. A total of 19 put her in contention for a trophy. The rest of the girls took their turns and Lindsey's 19 put her in 4th place-a fantastic performance.

Kelly drew the 12 (final) position to shoot. In the first round of 10 she hit 9. There were 2 girls with 10, some with 9 and 8. The 2nd round of 15 makes or breaks the final standings. Totals of 21, 22 and one with 23 before Kelly, last to shoot, needing 14 to tie for the lead and 15 out of 15 to win. She was in a groove 5,6,7, in a row then on the 8th basket the referee signaled a technical foul and no one could figure out what happened. She continued and finished without missing any. Her total was 24 but the mystery technical foul put her in a tie at 23. In the shoot-off the girls went 5 for 5. In the next round of 5 the Wisconsin girl hit 4 but Kelly only hit 3 giving her 2nd place. Hey, she got 2nd place in the whole country...**THAT'S GREAT!**

Needless to say, Kelly was quite upset as were her family and friends. This was the only time in 5 years of Hoop Shoot competition, at any level, that she was called for a technical foul. I find it hard to believe, as does Kelly & her parents. I have never seen her move her feet, she knows what she's doing. The event is video taped and will be examined by officials and they will tell the Hughes' what they see. Maybe the "powers that be" will make an unprecedented decision to correct a bad call.

We all attended that evening's awards banquet although it was difficult. Kelly accepted her silver trophy with class as a good sportsman does.

We all congratulate Lindsey and Kelly for their fine performance. They are our State & Regional Champs for 2007-8 and we are proud of them. I will pass along the judges decision when I learn the outcome of the debated ruling.

**Section D:** To qualify for a Lifetime Membership, an Auxiliary member must maintain membership in the Auxiliary for 25 consecutive years. Lifetime membership cards will be issued at the start of each fiscal year for qualified members. Members holding a Lifetime Card will be required to pay dues and benevolent monies as outlined in Article III. Section A

#### **ARTICLE IV-DELINQUENT**

**Section A:** A member's dues are due June 1st of the current year.

**Section B:** When a member is delinquent in the payment of dues, the Treasurer shall send a notice on June 1st. The list of delinquent members shall be read at the June business meeting. The Treasurer will send a final notice prior to the September business meeting. The list of delinquent members will be reread at the September business meeting and will be dropped by a vote of the membership.

#### **ARTICLE V – REINSTATEMENT**

**Section B & C:** Omit

#### **ARTICLE VII – ELECTIONS**

**Section F:** In the event of a resignation or death of an officer the President shall appoint a replacement

#### **ARTICLE VIII – QUALIFICATIONS OF A CANDIDATE**

**Section A:** No member shall hold more than one office at a time in the Auxiliary, elective or appointive. She must be a member for one year and in good standing.

#### **ARTICLE IX – OFFICERS**

**Section A:** Omit Corresponding and Financial Secretaries

**Section B:** Omit

**Section C:** Omit Organist

#### **ARTICLE X – DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT**

**Section J:** A year book may be prepared at the discretion of the President.

#### **ARTICLE XI – DUTIES OF THE VICE PRESIDENT**

**Section A:** The Vice President shall serve as aide to the President.

**Section G:** She shall be responsible for contacting the bereaved family and setting up a memorial service for a deceased member in good standing, and a donation to the Lamp of Memory if family so desires.

#### **ARTICLE XII – DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY AND ARTICLE XIII – DUTIES OF THE CORRESPONDING TO SECRETARY**

Omit entire Article XIII and add duties to Article XII.

Omit entire Article XV and add duties to Article XIV. References to collection to dues to Article III.

#### **ARTICLE XIX – ORGANIST** Omit

#### **ARTICLE XVII – COMMITTEES**

**Section C:** Audit. The President shall appoint three members to audit the Treasurer's books. The audit is to take place when books are completed and closed out from the preceding fiscal year.

**Section E:** Sunshine. The President shall appoint a Sunshine Chairlady. She shall send a card, at home, to an ill sister. If a sister in good standing is hospitalized, she shall send flowers or fruit. She shall check with the Treasurer regarding the member's status. A member in good standing shall receive only one floral/fruit gift in a fiscal year.
